

# ECO ADVENTURE FUN FACTS GIBBONS



Currently there are 3 species of Gibbons (Old World Primates) living in Cambodia all of which are on the endangered species list. These include the following species:

## LAR GIBBON

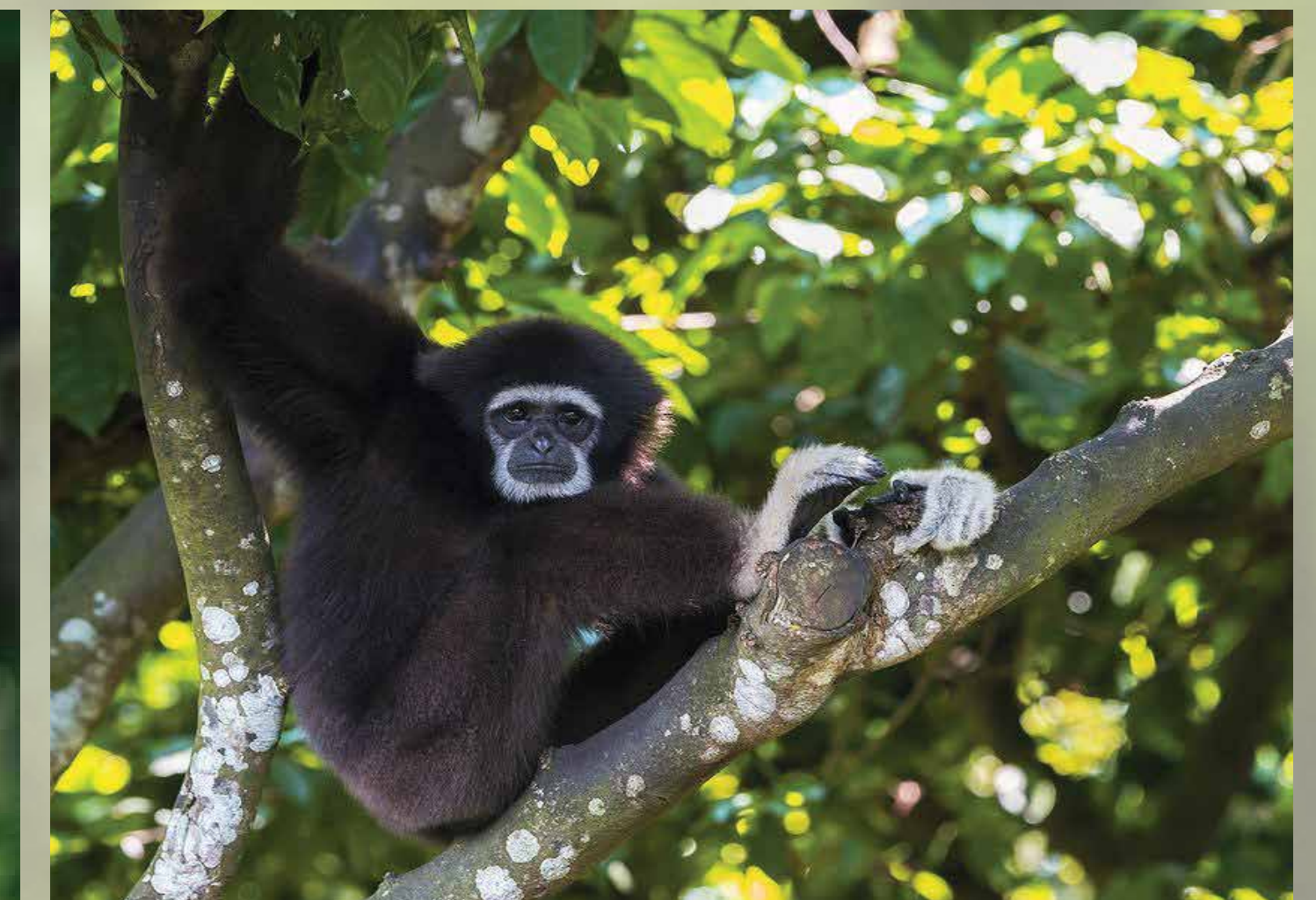
- The Lar Gibbon are also known as the White Handed Gibbon and are often seen in Zoos.
- This species has the largest range of all Gibbons and is found in jungles and river areas with large bamboo.
- They are now extinct in China but still found in Cambodia, Thailand, Burma and Malaysian Peninsula.
- Bird eggs also are a part of their diet along with fruit, figs, leaves and vines along with insects and even wasps.

## PILEATED GIBBON

- The males are all black with the females having a grey white color with only the head and belly black.
- Both species have a long white shaggy hair ring around their heads.
- They also have long arms as they spend over 95% of their life span in the trees.
- Their favorite food is local fruits but also will eat leaves and small animals.



## AGILE GIBBON



- The Agile Gibbon also is known as the Black handed Gibbon.
- The fur color on this species varies from black to a red brown coloring.
- They mate with one partner for their whole life like most Gibbons.
- Like all Gibbons they are tailless.
